STUDENT DELEGATE PROGRAM INFORMATION & APPLICATION

The San Francisco International Asian American Film Festival (SFI-AAFF) is proud to continue its annual Student Delegate Program (SDP). The program brings together a small but diverse student population to spend several days together during the Festival to view, discuss, and reflect on films and media. Hosted by Festival staff, students interact closely with industry guests and join in thoughtful conversations with selected filmmakers, artists, and other Festival guests.

The Program

If selected, student delegates are REQUIRED to:

- Follow the schedule planned for them during the 30th SFIAAFF (see sample schedule)
- Participate in online blogging and commenting on SFIAAFF's website
- Participate in group discussions about SFIAAFF films and events

Delegates will attend the planned film screenings and events as a group, led by a SFIAAFF staff. Students are welcome to attend additional Festival events and parties, but must be able to commit to the planned schedule. The program is open to both undergraduate and graduate college students. We encourage both film and non-film majors to apply. The most important qualities we seek in a candidate are a love for film and media, and a desire to share this passion, the ability to interact with other students and festival guests, and a willingness to follow a rigorous program of screenings and discussions. With only 6 spots available, each student's full commitment to the program is mandatory

Please keep in mind the program entails a challenging schedule with long hours—participants are responsible for their own travel and lodging and should plan accordingly.

YOUR APPLICATION (original plus two copies)

- 1. Completed application form
- 2. Essay on the following topic:

Considering the films, television and online media (like Youtube, Vimeo, etc) that you regularly view, how do you think these works address or ignore political and social issues in your community?

Please take time to seriously consider the prompt and limit your response to two pages (400-500 words). Be sure to include your name in the upper right corner.

3. Reference from instructor/adviser. You ONLY need the permission of your instructor/advisor to use him/her as a reference on the application form — you do not need a letter of recommendation. If you are considered as a candidate, we may contact your reference. You MUST receive permission from your instructor/adviser to use them as a reference.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE COMPLETE AND POST-MARKED BY JANUARY 31, 2012.

Applications will be reviewed immediately following the deadline, and results will be sent via email by Feb. 15, 2012. Please do not call before Feb. 15 for results.

The deadline will be strictly enforced. Incomplete applications may impact your opportunity for consideration. Travel, lodging and ancillary costs are solely your responsibility if you are accepted.
